INSTRUCTIONS:

For each flower, you need 4-6 pieces of colored tissue paper and 1 stem wire.

1. Stack the 4-6 pieces of tissue paper and fold accordion style, making the folds between the scallops in the paper. The color that will be the flower center, will be on top when you are done folding the paper.

Idea: Once the tissue paper is folded, you can create alternate petal shapes by cutting the scallop shape into a point or making small straight cuts to fringe the petals. See Figure D

- **2.** Secure the folded paper in the pre-bent stem wire by inserting the folded paper into the pre-bent end of the stem wire. Make sure the stem wire is in the center of the folded paper and pinch and/ or twist the wire to hold the tissue in place. See Figure A
- **3.** Holding the folded tissue paper in both hands, fan out the folded sheets. Gently curl the tissue paper up, starting with the top piece of tissue paper and working your way to the outer tissue paper. See Figures B and C.
