



Color Diffusing Easy Pack

YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- Assorted Liquid Watercolors
- Water-Based Markers
- Diffusion Paper Sheets and Leaf Shapes
- Brushes
- Paint Pipettes
- Spray Bottles
- Disposable Gloves
- Disposable Sleeves
- Table covers

YOU WILL NEED:

- Cups of Water
- Paper Towel

INSTRUCTIONS:

Liquid Watercolors are translucent paints, ideal for diffusing paper projects, but suitable for lots of other surfaces. Liquid watercolors are much more vibrant than traditional pan watercolor trays - the colors are absolutely brilliant! This paint can be used to color many other mediums: such as wood, macaroni, doilies, foam, sand, chipboard, construction paper, coffee filters, stamp pads, and fabric. You can use various applicators to apply this paint to your craft surface: brushes, sponges, stamps, paint pipettes, squeeze and spray bottles. Color Diffusion Paper is especially suitable for liquid watercolor painting; the colors blend into each other and create a tie-dye like effect on the paper.

IMPORTANT NOTE: This bold concentrated paint formula will stain skin and clothing. Cover your work surface with plastic table covers and use the protective gloves and sleeves provided.

Apply the Liquid Watercolor with a brush, drip with the pipettes, or mist layers of color using the spray bottles, onto the diffusing paper for colorful exciting effects. To help get you started we have listed three of the most popular diffusing techniques below. Experiment to see which technique or combination of methods you like best!

Wet to Wet Application- First mist paper with water and then drip or brush liquid watercolor onto the wet paper for fast and dramatic effects. Wet to Dry Application - Drip or brush the liquid watercolor directly onto dry diffusing paper for super bold yet more controlled areas of color. You can then mist with water to blend/diffuse the colors more slowly.

Water-Based Markers- Use these to add extra detail or as a replacement for the liquid watercolor paint. Mist with water and watch the colors blend together! If layering markers over the watercolors make sure the painted paper is dry first to avoid ripping the paper.

MORE IDEAS...

Salt Crystal Pictures:

Additional Materials Needed: Salt and Paint Paper Instruction: Apply liquid watercolor using your preferred method. While the watercolor is still wet, sprinkle salt on the picture and watch crystals appear. Allow to dry.

Straw Painting:

Additional Materials Needed: Plastic Straws and Paint Paper Instruction: Using the pipettes, place drops of liquid watercolor randomly onto the sheet of paper. Use the straw to blow the paint around on the paper, to create a funky splattered effect. Allow to dry.

Crayon Resist Painting:

Additional Materials Needed: Paint Paper and Crayons Instruction: Draw a picture or words on the paper with crayons. Use the watercolor to paint over the crayon. The paint will not cover the crayon markings and will only color the places where there is no crayon. If you use white crayons on white paper, you can create secret messages or drawings, revealed only when painted with the watercolor!

Spray Stencil Art:

Additional Materials Needed: Stencils, Paint Paper and Tape Instruction: Fill the spray bottles with liquid watercolor. Lay the stencil on the paper and spray on colors to fill in the design. Use one color or use multi colors to create interest. Remove the stencil and tape. Allow to dry.
