Soccer Diorama Assembly

Your completed SOCCER FIELD DIORAMA will look similar to the one on the front page. You can change the look by using your own creativity.

Step # 1

Separate all of the printed components from the cardboard sheets. There will be pictures of soccer players, goals and a large piece of cardboard that will serve as the soccer field.

Step # 2

Use the supplied crayons to decorate all the pieces of your diorama. You can also use your own colored pencils or markers for decorating. Use your own creativity to make your diorama special.

Step # 3

After coloring all of your pieces you are ready to assemble your diorama.

- 1. Fold up the diorama and snap together the bottom tabs to hold the soccer field in its proper shape. You can add glue to the tabs to hold the soccer field in the shape.
- 2. Place the goals in their proper locations and glue in place.
- 3. Put the supports on the back of the soccer players. They can be moved all around the field.
- 4. When completed the "COMPLETION" plaque can be glued to the field.
- 5. You can personalize the players by gluing a photo of your own face and your friends' faces on the players. This makes it even more fun!



Basic Soccer Facts

- Eleven players on each side.
- Some younger school teams have fewer players on each team.
- An official size soccer field) is approximately 115 feet long and approximately 75 feet wide.
- The basic player positions are goalie, defenders, mid-field and attackers.
- Soccer players need to be able to run, kick the ball and control the ball.
- It takes a lot of practice to become a skilled soccer player.
- The most important part of playing soccer is TEAM WORK! No one player can win a game. You must work together to pass the ball to each other and to be in a position to score a goal.
- The winning team is the team that has scored the most goals when the game is over.
