Fishing Diorama Assembly

Your completed FISHING DIORAMA will look similar to the completed project on the front page.

Step # 1

Separate all of the printed components from the cardboard sheets. There will be pictures of fishing scenes as well as a large piece of cardboard to be used as the diorama frame.

Step # 2

Use the supplied crayons to decorate all the pieces of your diorama. You can also use your own colored pencils or markers for decoration. Use your own creativity.

Step # 3

After coloring all your pieces you are ready to assemble your diorama.

- 1. Fold up the diorama frame (large piece) and snap together the bottom tabs to hold the frame in its proper shape. You can add glue to the tabs to keep the frame in its proper shape.
- 2. Place and glue all the pieces in locations that you think look best.
- 3. When completed, glue the "completion" plaque to the diorama frame.

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

As you know, fishing is an age old past-time that is both relaxing and challenging. There are several types of fishing that are suited to the individual that are extremely popular.

- **FLY FISHING** Generally done in a lake or river without a boat and takes a good degree of skill. Fly fishing requires the fisherman to wear high wader boots to keep the fisherman dry while standing in the water. Casting a "fly" to the approximate area of the fish requires a practices skill.
- **BOAT OR DOCK FISHING** Generally, this type of fishing attracts a larger fish and requires heavier fishing equipment.
