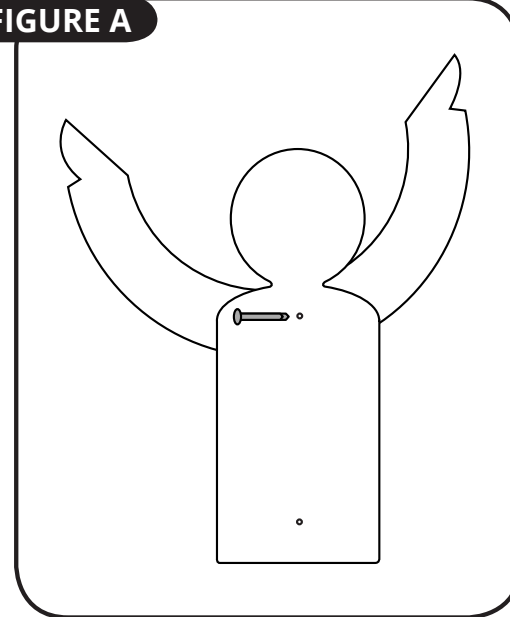

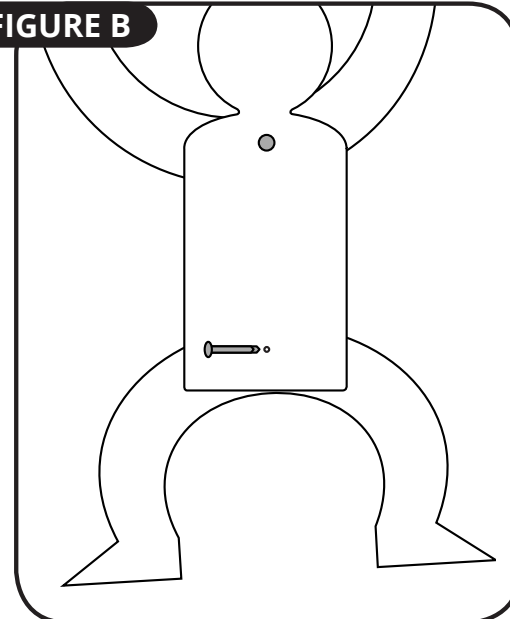
## INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Select one set of doll parts. You should have one body with head, arms and legs.
2. Paint skin tone and clothing as desired. Let dry.
3. Paint on facial features and clothing details. Let dry.
4. Using yarn, create hair for your doll (see opposite page for ideas).
5. Glue hair to doll. Let dry.
6. After the doll is fully dry, place arms behind the body, lining up the holes. Attach the two pieces with a paper fastener (see Figure A).
7. Place the legs behind the body lining up the holes. Attach with a paper fastener (see Figure B).
8. Cut out one printed body plaque. Write something about yourself or your family in the space provided.
9. Using a small amount of glue, attach your body plaque to your doll. Let dry.
10. Using the leftover yarn and poms poms add 3-D details to your doll.

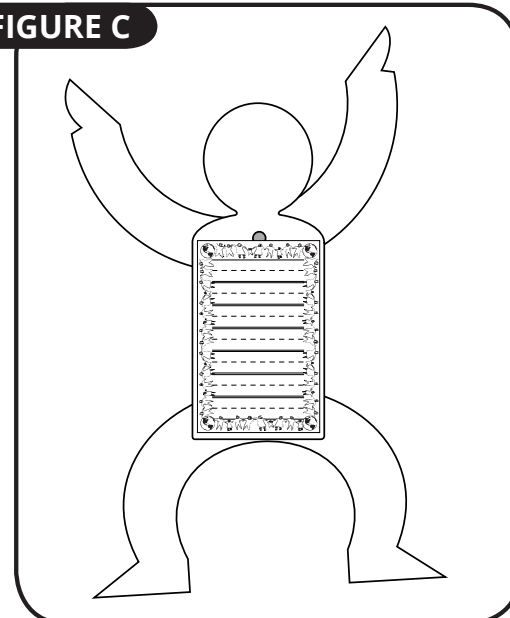

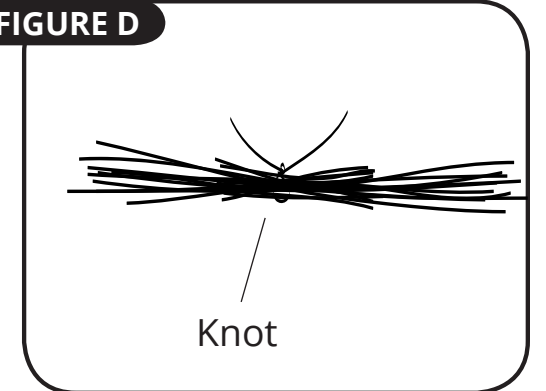


## HAIR IDEAS:

### Braids and Bangs

Cut at least nine, 16" pieces of yarn (more for thicker braids) and lay them on your work surface. Cut about 18 pieces of yarn that are approximately 4" in length. Lay these on top of the 16" pieces, so that the middle of each strand lines up. Cut a 5" piece of yarn and use it to tie all the yarn pieces together (see Figure D). Braid each side of the hair using only the long pieces. Tie ends off with a contrasting color of yarn. Glue hair to top of head and trim bangs to desired length (see Figure E).

### Long or Short Hair

Cut about 25 pieces of yarn that are each about 14" in length. Lay them on your work surface and tie them together as described above. Glue hair to head. Let dry. Trim as desired.

### Spiky Hair

Cut about 25 pieces of yarn that are each about 3" in length. Glue each individual piece of yarn to the head creating a spiky pattern. Let dry. Trim hair to create a flat top or leave at varying lengths. Try using different colors of yarn mixed together for a wild effect!
