

# Blast Off Rocket Frame (Pk/48)

#### PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING



AGE GROUP: 6 and up PROJECT TIME: 20 minutes

#### YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- Foam Rocket Bodies
- Foam Round Picture Windows
- Foam Sheets of Wings
- Foam Sheets of Tail Parts and Rocket Top
- Foam Sheets of Dots

**NOTE:** All pieces except for the Rocket Bodies are self-adhesive.

#### YOU WILL NEED:

- Scissors
- Pencil
- Photograph for Frame
- Glue (optional)

#### EACH PERSON SHOULD HAVE:

- 1 Rocket Body
- 1 Round Picture Window
- 1 Sheet of Wings
- 1 Sheet of Tail Parts and Rocket Top (in color of your choice)
- 14 Dots (in color of your choice)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

**NOTE:** If working with with younger children we recommend an instructor's help with Step 1.

- 1. Punch the center round piece out of the yellow round picture window. Use your pencil to lightly trace the circle "ring" on your picture. Trace around the outer and the inner sides of the yellow ring. Carefully cut out your picture following the outer pencil line. It is okay if you cut a little closer to the inside circle, just don't cut following the inside circle or your picture may fall out of the frame.
- 2. Referring to Figure A on the next page, position your photo on the center part of the rocket body. Peel off the paper backing from the yellow picture window "ring" and carefully position the ring on the picture. Press down.

**TIP:** If you want to make sure that your picture is really secure, use a dab to glue down your photo to the rocket body first.

- 3. Peel off the paper backing and press all wing parts, tail parts and rocket top into place. Use the instruction photo as a guide for position.
- 4. Peel off the paper backing and press down the "dots" around the yellow picture window frame and on rocket as shown in photo.
