INSTRUCTIONS:

- 2. Thread jute onto needle.
- 3. Prepare basket "panels" for threading: fold each panel towards the center of the basket from the base.
- 4. Take 2 panels and overlap at the holes closed to each other. Thread the jute out through the overlapped hole. Overlap the next panel at the closest to the open hole of the first panel. Thread jute in towards center of the basket.
- 5. Continue to overlap each new panel and thread jute in and out of the panels.
- 6. When all panels have been threaded together, tie a double knot close to the last hole. Cut jute off.
- 7. Decorate the basket by removing the back of the felt stickers and pressing stickers firmly to the basket.
