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INSTRUCTIONS:

Note: This project can be a simple stitching project or even a cross stitch design. For the finished sample shown here, we decided to do some simple color blocks using the included colors of floss and stitching in different directions. We stitched the design in the Random Long Stitch (see below). For the finish, we made a simple tassel on the zipper pull.

- 1. Plan your design first. If you prefer you can even lightly sketch your design on the bag, using the pencil. There is plenty of floss so you can stitch both sides of the bag if you'd like!
- 2. Cut a length of floss. Thread the needle and tie a simple overhand knot in one end of the yarn, leaving the other strand loose.
- 3. Stitch your design. When you are done stitching one color, tie a knot by making a loop of floss by threading the needle through some floss on the inside of the bag. Then bring the needle/floss through the loop and pull to make a knot. Cut the floss off and change the color of floss referring to Step #2 above.

Note: We stitched our design using the Random Long Stitch. That is a stitch usually used to fill in or make shapes with randomly placed short and long straight stitches which makes it perfect for a project like this one. Basically, the stitching pattern is: UP then count 1, 2, 3, 4 to the right, then DOWN then count 1, 2, 3, 4 to the right then UP then back left 1, 2, 3, 4 then down. You may use a different stitch if you prefer.

Tip: We recommend you don't stitch too close to the edges of the bag, as it may be difficult to maneuver the needle inside the bag.
