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

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#### **PREP INSTRUCTIONS:**

Unroll the kite. Set aside the sticks and the kite string.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Place kit on your work surface with the front side up (tail is on the back side).
- 2. Plan a design and color the kite with the permanent markers. Let dry.
- **TIP:** Start coloring at the top of the kite and work your way down.
- 3. To assemble the kite: turn the kite over. Take 1 stick and insert the end through the left hole, into the pocket on the front of the kite. Connect the other end of the stick into the centerpiece on the back. Repeat these steps with the 2nd stick, on the right back side of the kite.
- 4. Tie the end of the kite string on the loop on the front of the kite.

KITE SAFETY: Parental guidance is recommended when flown by children 8 years old and younger. Never fly a kite near electric wires. Always be sure the cord on a kite is dry. Electricity can pass through wire, wet cord or cord with metal on it.

#### **MORE IDEAS...**

• Have a kite flying contest and see whose kite can go the highest.

- Decorate with glitter glaze and watch it sparkle in the sun.
