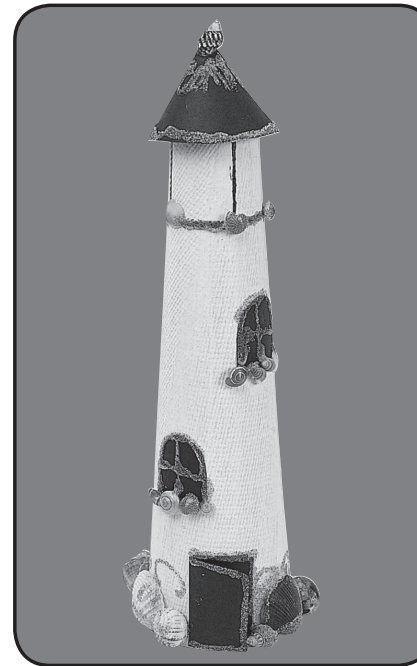

YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- Cardboard Cones
- Sand
- Shells
- Paper
- Brushes
- Glue
- Paint

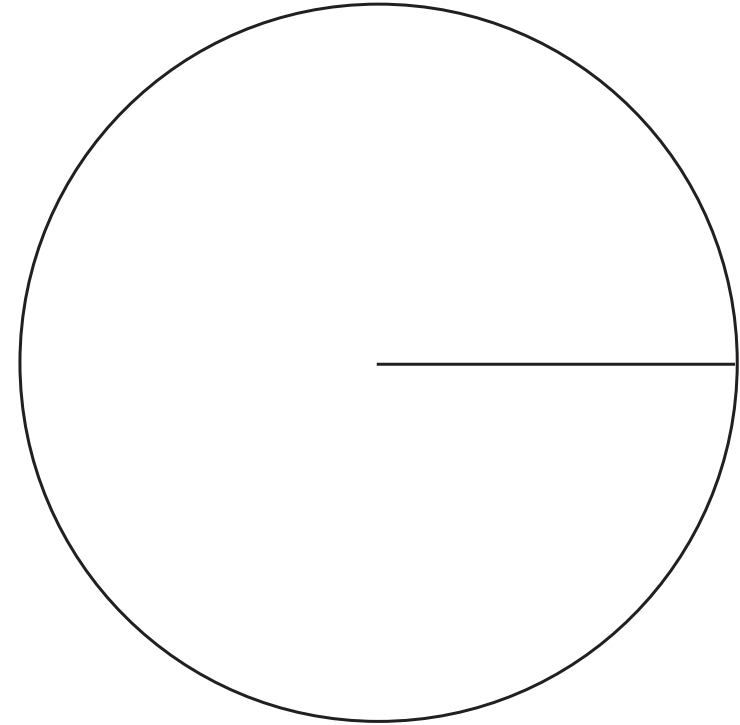
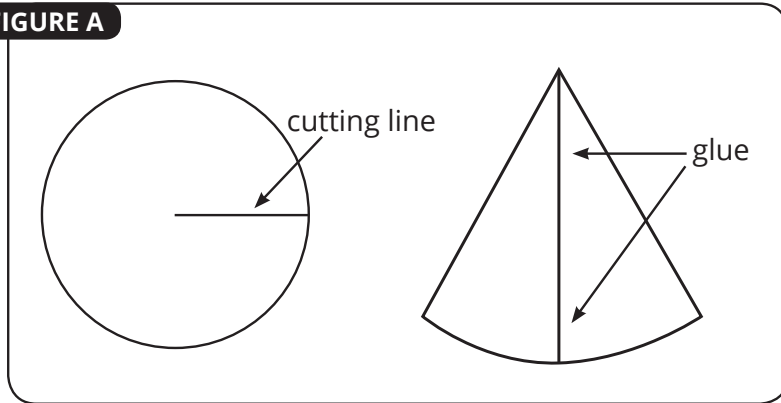
YOU WILL NEED:

- Scissors
- Containers for Water and Paint
- Paper towels
- Pencil (optional)

AGE GROUP: 8 and up
PREP TIME: 10 minutes
PROJECT TIME: 45 minutes

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Select a cone and paint it white with a foam brush. Let dry.
TIP: Add small amounts of water a few drops at a time to the paint. This will help it flow better.
2. Cut out the pattern for the roof on page 3. Trace onto a piece of construction paper and cut out. Design your own windows and doors and cut them out of the construction paper also.
TIP: Sketch out your doors and windows with pencil before your start to cut.
3. To make the roof: Bend the construction paper circle, overlapping the ends until you form a cone shape (see Figure A). Glue the overlapped edges. Let dry.

4. Glue the roof, windows and doors onto the painted cone. Let dry.
5. Glue the shells around the base, windows and roof. Let dry.
6. Apply some glue onto the areas you want sand, then brush glue out into a smooth layer on the roof, windows and the door. Sprinkle sand onto wet glue. Shake off excess and let dry.

Helpful Hint: To make your lighthouse look more weathered, brush small amounts of glue and sand all around your lighthouse's edges.
