Bird Sun Catcher (Pk/12)

PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING



YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- Sun Catcher Frames
- Assorted Glass Stain Paint
- Brushes

YOU WILL NEED:

- Paper Towels
- Toothpicks
- Suction Cup Hooks (Item # SG856)

AGE GROUP: 8 and up
PROJECT TIME: 30 minutes

EACH PERSON SHOULD HAVE:

- 1 Sun Catcher Frame
- 1 Paint Brush
- 1 Toothpick
- 1 Cup of Water & Paper Towel

The glass stain paint will be shared among the group.

PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS:

It helps to make photocopies of the color chart for everyone to reference as they paint their sun catcher. You can follow this color chart provided or create your own design. You can also mix the paint together to create custom colors. Try mixing white with the darker colors to make new shades. Don't shake the paint bottles; this just creates unwanted bubbles!

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Place your sun catcher frame down flat on your work surface and decide on a color scheme. You can follow the color chart provided or create your own.
2. Carefully fill the open spaces of your frame with the designated colors of paint. Use the toothpick or paint brush to spread the paint and fill in the cavity. Be careful not to overfill each cavity. To reduce the amount of bubbles, keep the tip of the bottle in contact with the frame's surface. Any bubbles that do occur can be easily popped with the toothpick.
3. Next allow your finished sun catcher to dry completely on a flat surface. You can loop a hook with an attached suction cup through the eyelet at the top of the frame to hang your finished project in the window.
