Tie-Dye Journal (Pk/24)

YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- Bound Journals
- Construction Paper
- Filter Paper
- Glue
- Glue Stick
- Watercolor Paint

AGE GROUP: 8 and up
PREP TIME: 5 minutes
PROJECT TIME: 45 minutes

YOU WILL NEED:

- Scissors
- Rulers
- Pencil
- Newspaper to Absorb Extra Paint (optional)
- Spray Bottle of Water (optional)

PROJECT INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Select two filters. Place them on top of the waterproof work surface.* Select colors of paint for each filter. Gently squeeze the paint bottles, letting drops of watercolor soak into the filters. Let the paint spread before adding more paint. Spritz with water to increase paint spreading. When both of the filters are fully colored leave them flat to dry.
*It's a good idea to put newspaper underneath filter to absorb excess paint.
2. Place one 9" x 6" sheet of construction paper flat on your work surface. Using the glue stick cover the white side of the back journal cover. Place cover on top of the paper glue side down. Make sure that the paper edge does not overlap the holes in the cover (see Figure A).
3. Trim corners of the paper at an angle (see Figure B). Fold over all three flaps and glue them down. Let dry.
4. Cut 2" off the side of one of the filters (see Figure C).
5. Using the filter, cover the front cover following the same technique described above (see Figure D).








6. Take a second sheet of black paper and cut a 3" x 8" rectangle. Fold the ends of the rectangle over so that you have a rectangle that is 3" x 6" (see Figure E).
7. Lay the book face down and open on your work surface. Using the Ultratac glue attach one long side of the rectangle to the front cover with the flaps facing down (see Figure F for placement). Let dry.
8. Place the book face down and closed on your work surface. Wrap the loose end of the rectangle around to the back of the book. Do not pull tight. Glue the edge in place (see Figure G). Let dry.
9. Open your book and using the glue stick attach the first page and the last page to the covers. This will hide the raw paper edges on the inside of the covers.
10. Place book face up on work surface. Decorate as desired with the second colored filter.




