

10621 Bean Bag Toss Board

The Bean Bag Toss Board is a free standing angle board with easy to hit target holes which players attempt to toss their beanbags through. The primary goal of the activity is to have fun and can be useful in teaching underhand throw, overhand throw and math skills.

Contents:

- 1 – Target Board
- 2 – Wood Support Blocks
- 12 – Beanbags (in 2 or more colors)

Set Up:

Slide the target board into the two slots in the wood base. The board will lean back at an angle. Determine an appropriate distance from which players are to toss their beanbags. If unsure, about 4 feet is a good distance to try and then to adjust accordingly. Designate the toss loss with cones, floor tape or some other means.



For practicing proper underhand and overhand forms, players stand with their feet split front to back with the foot opposite of their throwing hand forward and right at the toss line. For variety and building strength and coordination with both hands, players should alternate throwing hands during different games or different rounds of the same game.

In many of the games below, the person going first has an advantage. If more than one game is played, the person going first should alternate between players.

Scoring and Game Options:

Quick Toss – Players toss a set number of beanbags from behind the toss line and earn points for any bags that pass through the holes on the board. The number of points earned corresponds to the number printed below the hole. The player with the most number of points wins.

One Hundred Forty – Players alternate tossing beanbags at the board and earn points for any bags that pass through the board. The first player to earn 140 points wins. If a player goes over 140 points, their total goes back to 100.

Cover All – Players alternate tossing beanbags at the board. The first player to toss a beanbag through each of the holes wins.

3 in a Row – This is a 2 player game with the object being for a single player to “own” three target holes in a straight line (diagonal). Players alternate tossing beanbags at the board. If a bag is thrown through a hole the player then owns that hole. To designate ownership of a hole a player take their bag and rest it at the bottom of the hole with half the bag on each side of the board. If the 2nd player tosses a bag through the same hole, they then take ownership of that hole. Knocking the beanbag off the board, does not change ownership of the hole. The first player to own 3 targets in a row wins the game.
