INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Have each person select a design to paint.
2. Dip the brush in the water and paint 1 color or small section at a time. Start painting at the top and work your way down the page. Rinse the brush in-between colors.

TIP: Use a generous amount of water so the paint looks washy and fewer brush strokes are visible. You may want to use a soft camel hair brush if you're aiming for a washy watercolor effect.

3. Let your finished design dry on a flat surface so the colors won't run together.
4. Fold the easel back along the score line and remove paper on self adhesive strip. Center easel on the back side of painting at the bottom edge and press down firmly. Display your finished painting.
