


- 1. Use the markers to color the mandala design.
- 2. Choose the quote you would like to collage onto your mandala design.
- 3. Cut the quote into strips of paper or even each word can be cut separately.

**TIP:** Be creative! Besides cutting the quote into strips or individual words, you can also mix words from other quotes and make up your own quote.

- 4. Experiment with the quote layout by planning the words on the mandala design and move around until you find a layout that you like.
  - Play with grouping different lines together.
  - Try centering the lines or lining them up in different ways.
  - The idea is to be creative with the words and the layout of the quote.
- 5. Once you have a design that you like, use the glue stick to adhere the quote/words down in position.


6. Let dry.
















## Fun Facts• Eye Opening Art
