

CU-246: Bead Kit II (4.4 – 5.4)

Supplies:

KIT INCLUDES:

Assorted Beads 

Plastic Lace 

Key Rings 

Lanyard Hooks 

YOU WILL ALSO NEED:

Scissors 

Bins to hold Heads 

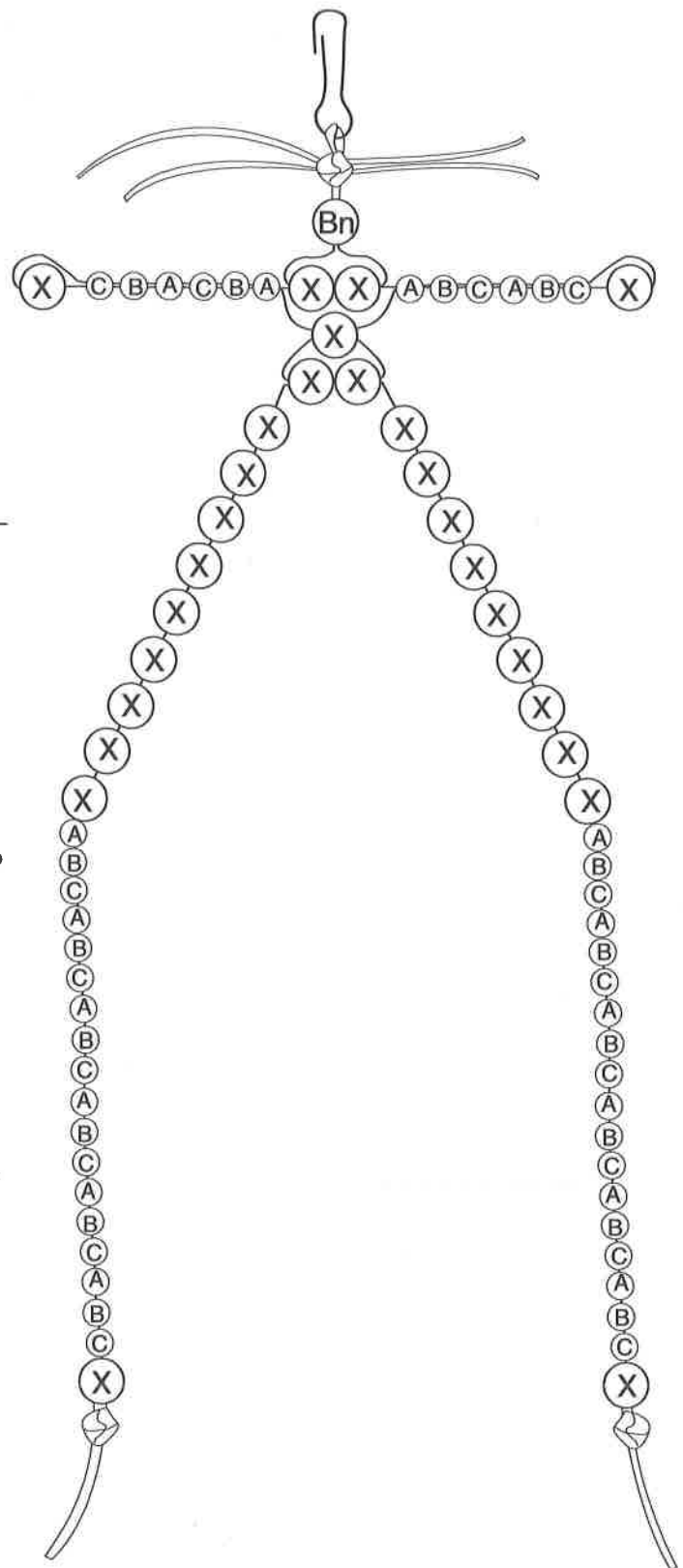
Masking Tape

Mocko Jumbi Man

Supplies

- 45 inch (110 cm) length of plastic cord
- Key ring with attached lanyard hook
- Beads: 1 brown, 27 large beads (all same color); 48 small beads (16 each of three colors)

1. Tape lanyard to table top with masking tape to stabilize work.
2. Thread plastic lace through lanyard and even ends.
3. Push both ends of lace through brown bead and push to lanyard.
4. To make shoulders, put 2 large beads on one lace and push them to the lanyard. Thread the other lace through these 2 beads in the opposite direction. Pull on both lace ends to tighten. Untwist lace so that it lies flat.
5. To make arm, place 6 small beads on one lace in following pattern: A, B, C, A, B, C. Slide beads to body. Add 1 large bead and slide it down to small beads. Insert the lace back through the 6 small beads. Tighten all the beads.



Bead Kit II (continued)

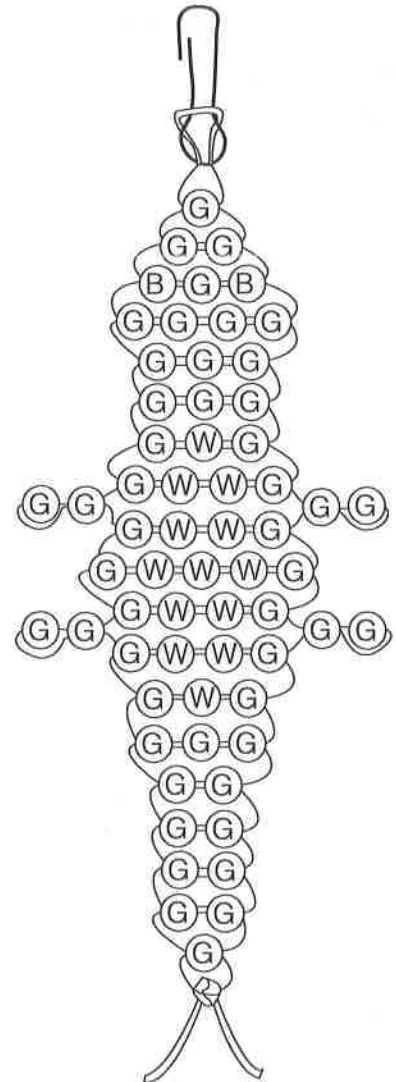
- Repeat with other lace to make second arm.
- To make torso, put 1 large bead on one lace and push to body. Insert other lace through this bead in the opposite direction. Pull on both lace ends to tighten.
- Repeat the above step with 2 large beads to make the hips.
- To make legs, place beads on each lace in the following pattern: 9 large beads, 6 groups of small beads in A, B, C order, 1 large bead. Tighten beads.
- Tie an overhand knot at the end of both laces. Trim lace ends 1" below knot. Remaining lace is used to make hair.
- To make hair, hold two laces as a unit and tie knot between lanyard and brown bead. Pull tightly to secure knot.

Gecko

Supplies

- 60" (150 cm) length of plastic lace
- Key ring with attached lanyard hook
- Beads: 48 green, 2 black, 13 white

- Attach lace to small lanyard with knot as shown in figure.
- Tape lanyard to table top with masking tape to stabilize work.
- Place 1 green bead on one lace and slide it down to the lanyard.
- Pick up the other lace and push it through the bead in the opposite direction. Pull on both laces to tighten Row 1. Keep lace as flat as possible by removing twists as they occur.
- Continue to make rows in the same way as follows:
Row 2: 2 green
Row 3: 1 black, 1 green, 1 black
Row 4: 4 green
Row 5: 3 green
Row 6: 3 green
Row 7: 1 green, 1 white, 1 green
Row 8: 1 green, 2 white, 1 green
- To make leg, place 2 green beads on one lace and slide down to the body. Insert lace back through the bead closest to the body and tighten. Repeat with other lace.



Bead Kit II (continued)

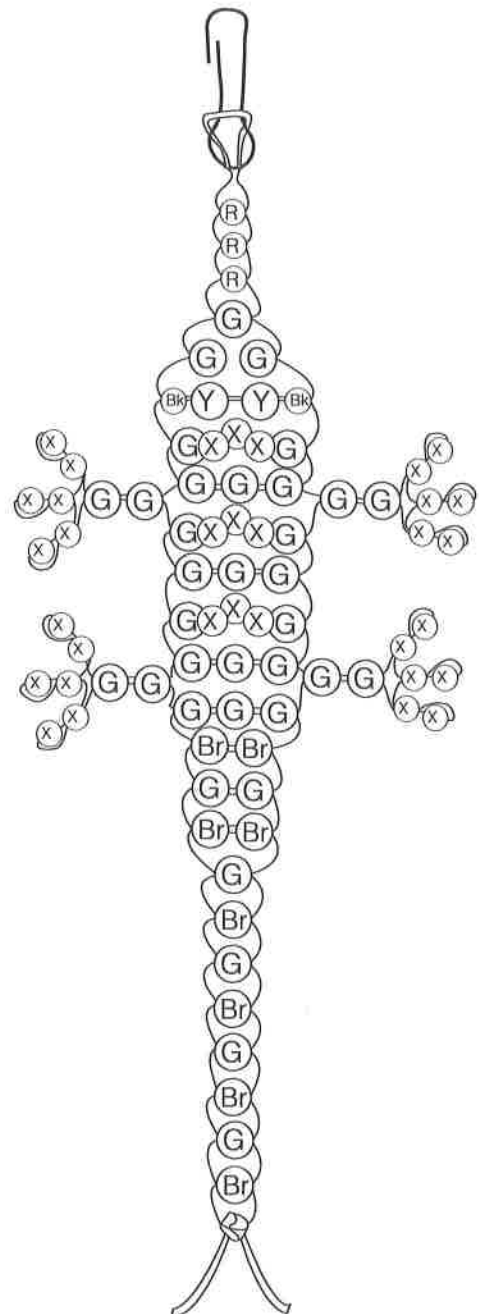
7. Continue to make rows as follows:
 - Row 9: 1 green, 2 white, 1 green
 - Row 10: 1 green, 3 white, 1 green
 - Row 11: 1 green, 2 white, 1 green
8. Follow step 6 to make 2 more legs.
9. Continue to make rows as follows:
 - Row 12: 1 green, 2 white, 1 green
 - Row 13: 1 green, 1 white, 1 green
 - Row 14: 3 green
 - Row 15-18: 2 green
 - Row 19: 1 green
10. Tie an overhand knot with both laces. Cut off excess.

Iguana

Supplies

- 60" (150 cm) plastic lace
- Key ring with attached lanyard hook
- Beads: (Note: the following colors are suggested. Other combinations may be used.)
 - Large beads: 35 green, 2 yellow, 8 brown
 - Small beads: 3 red (nose), 2 black (eyes),
9 (arches) selected color,
24 (toes) selected color

1. Attach lace to small lanyard with knot as shown in figure.
2. Tape lanyard to table top with masking tape to stabilize work.
3. Place 1 red bead on one lace and slide it down to the lanyard.
4. Pick up the other lace and push it through the bead in the opposite direction. Pull on both laces to tighten Row 1. Keep lace as flat as possible by removing twists as they occur.
5. Continue to make rows in the same way as follows:
 - Row 2 and 3: 1 red
 - Row 4: 1 large green
 - Row 5: 2 large green
 - Row 6: 1 small black, 2 large yellow, 1 small black



Bead Kit II (continued)

6. To make an arch on row 7, place 1 large green, 3 small beads, and 1 large green on lace. Insert other lace through large green beads only (first and last beads on the row) in the opposite direction. Pull on both laces to tighten so that an arch of small beads is formed.
7. Row 8: 3 large green beads (flat row.)
8. To make leg, place 2 large green beads on one lace and slide them down to the body. To make toe at end of leg, place 2 small beads on the lace and slide them to the green leg beads. Insert the lace back through the small bead closest to the green beads and pull tight. Repeat 2 more times to make 2 more toes. Insert lace back through 2 green leg beads to complete the leg.
9. Repeat step 8 with other lace to make second leg.
10. Continue to make rows as follows:
 - Row 9: repeat arch row (step 6)
 - Row 10: 3 large green beads (flat row)
 - Row 11: repeat arch row (step 6)
 - Row 12: 3 large green beads (flat row)
11. Make 2 legs (step 8)
12. Continue to make rows as follows:
 - Row 13: 3 large green
 - Row 14: 2 brown
 - Row 15: 2 large green
 - Row 16: 2 brown
 - Row 17-24: alternate large green and brown beads.
13. Tie overhand knot with both laces. Cut off excess.
